Islington Council's Community Chest (ICCC) Annual review, June 2023

Introduction

Islington Council's Community Chest exists to support small organisations that, with local knowledge and reach, make a big difference to local residents. Islington Council's Community Chest provides small organisations with grants of up to £5,000. Priority is given to organisations that have an annual turnover of less than £50,000 and work with people who are experiencing poverty and isolation. There are three application rounds a year supporting a wide range of projects, reaching out to a diverse mix of Islington residents who typically do not access services or who have limited social networks.

Applications for Islington Council's Community Chest are considered by a panel made up of Islington Councillors, Cripplegate Foundation Governors and members of the Islington's Voluntary and Community Sector.

Groups can apply under six themes that together address local priorities and issues facing Islington residents:


- Advice and support
- Educating and improving skills and employability
- Improving community safety
- Improving mental and physical health
- Making Islington a more sustainable place to live
- Reducing isolation and increasing involvement in the community

Islington Council's Community Chest actively seeks to fund projects that as a whole are inclusive of all people regardless of their age, culture, disabilities, ethnic origin, gender, nationality, race, religion or sexual orientation.

Funded groups are often reliant on local volunteers, people who are dedicated to improving their local communities and reaching out to support people in need.


Who Islington Council's Community Chest reached in 2022/2023

- 81 community groups applied to Islington Council's Community Chest in 2022-23
- 56 community groups (69% of applicants) were awarded funding, totalling grants of over £235,255
- 17 (30%) of the 56 funded groups received Islington Council's Community Chest funding for the first time
- 18 (32%) of the 56 funded groups have received 5 or more grants



Who Islington Council's Community Chest reached in 2021/2022*

- 70 community groups applied to Islington Council's Community Chest in 2021-22
- 52 community groups (74% of applicants) were awarded funding, totalling grants of over £234,140
- 12 (23%) of the 52 funded groups received Islington Council's Community Chest funding for the first time
- 16 (31%) of the 52 funded groups have received 5 or more grants


As the tables above show, the ICCC Programme has continued to bounce back from the understandable dip experienced across 2020/21 due to the Coronavirus pandemic and related lockdowns. Indeed, with 81 applications received in 2022/23 this is greater than the 80 received in the last pre-pandemic year of 2019/20 and a 59% increase on the 52 applications received in 2020/21 at the height of lockdowns. Also reassuring is the proportion of successful applicants that remain at comparable levels with previous years, with approximately three quarters of


applications successfully receiving funding in the preceeding three years; pre-pandemic, during the worst year of lockdowns, and as the country has returned to some level of normality. With a greater number of applications inevitably comes greater competition for funds and this is reflected in the slightly lower success rate in 2022/23 compared to last year. However, at 69% over two thirds of those applying were awarded funding. This is an indication of good quality applications coming through and demonstrates that projects that do apply have a good chance of receiving funds – something that is important for a grass roots funding programme like the Community Chest. The fact that both the numbers and proportion of first time applications and those that have received five or more grants have increased in 2022/23 compared to last year is another positive factor to note. This ensures that a good balance remains between funding new and emerging projects with providing longer term support. With five more applications (representing a 29% increase) compared to last year, it is particularly reassuring to see this significant increase in the number of first time applications.


The pie charts above also demonstrate how the programme has generally returned to a more predictable pattern in terms of the proportion of applications received under each priority. The two priority areas that traditionally receive the highest proportion of applications overall (Reducing Isolation and Improving Mental/Physical Health) have once again received the highest number of applications in 2022/23, as they did in 2021/22 following a dip in 2020/21. However, they are both slightly lower this year with applications made under the education and skills priority increasing significantly compared to last year, which again is a positive indicator of the sector responding to need following the pandemic, as well as a more diverse complement of projects awarded funding. Taking into account the ongoing fall-out from the pandemic which is now compounded with a devastating cost-of-living crisis, it is of some concern that there appears to have been a dip in funded projects that provide advice and support to local residents.

Following the decision two years ago to split the Improving the Environment and Increasing Community Safety theme into two separate themes focusing each on environment and community safety as a means to try and encourage more applications under each, there has been a slight increase in funded projects seeking to improve the environment although projects funded to increase community safety have remained lower (with only one project funded under this priority area in 2022/23).

Facts and figures – who we reached in 2021/22







The charts above provide a breakdown of the age, ethnicity, and gender of all people that have benefited from the support provided as a result of Islington Council's Community Chest funding over the 2021/22 period. The data is derived from returned monitoring reports so provides an accurate reflection of the work actually undertaken. Although slightly lower compared to last year, the breakdowns demonstrate that the ICCC programme continues to provide good reach into BAMER communities, representing 57% (65% in 2020/21) of all beneficiaries compared to 32% overall Islington population (not including Irish/White Other). In terms of age groups, at 44% of residents benefiting from funded projects in 2021/22 adults (aged 25-59) continue to be the highest proportion of beneficiaires overall and is slightly higher compared to 2020/21 (42%). This can be explained in part because it is also the widest age specific reporting category. A quarter of overall beneficiaries are older people (60+) which has remained fairly consistent with last year. While the proportion of beneficiaries under the age of 5 (9%) has increased compared to a low level in 2020/21 (3%), beneficiaries aged 6-11 have remained the same at 9% while the proportion of beneficiaries for both the 12-16 age group (7% compared to 12% in 2020/21) and 17-24s (9% compared to 12% in 2020/21) have both declined.
