# Islington Council's Community Chest (ICCC) Annual review, June 2024

#### Introduction

Islington Council's Community Chest exists to support small organisations that, with local knowledge and reach, make a huge difference to local residents. Islington Council's Community Chest provides small organisations with grants of up to £5,000. Priority is given to organisations working with people who are experiencing poverty and isolation. There were three application rounds in 2023/24 supporting a wide range of projects, reaching out to a diverse mix of Islington residents who typically do not access services or who have limited social networks.

Applications for Islington Council's Community Chest are considered by a panel made up of Islington Councillors, Cripplegate Foundation Governors and members of the Islington's Voluntary and Community Sector.

Groups can apply under six themes that together address local priorities and issues facing Islington residents:


- Advice and support
- Educating and improving skills and employability
- Improving community safety
- Improving mental and physical health
- Making Islington a more sustainable place to live
- Reducing isolation and increasing involvement in the community

Islington Council's Community Chest actively seeks to fund projects that as a whole are inclusive of all people regardless of their age, culture, disabilities, ethnic origin, gender, nationality, race, religion or sexual orientation.

Funded groups are often reliant on local volunteers, people who are dedicated to improving their local communities and reaching out to support people in need.


#### Who Islington Council's Community Chest reached in 2023/2024

- 89 community groups applied to Islington Council's Community Chest in 2023-24
- 53 community groups (60% of applicants) were awarded funding, totalling grants of £215,580
- 15 (28%) of the 53 funded groups received Islington Council's Community Chest funding for the first time
- 18 (34%) of the 53 funded groups have received 5 or more grants



#### Who Islington Council's Community Chest reached in 2022/2023

- 81 community groups applied to Islington Council's Community Chest in 2022-23
- 56 community groups (69% of applicants) were awarded funding, totalling grants of over £235.255
- 17 (30%) of the 56 funded groups received Islington Council's Community Chest funding for the first time
- 18 (32%) of the 56 funded groups have received 5 or more grants





As the tables above show, the ICCC Programme continues to experience high and increasing demand as the number of applications to the programme increase. With 89 received in 2023/24 the Programme is seeing higher numbers of applications than prior to the 2020 lockdowns. Although the proportion of successful applicants has dipped slightly compared to 2022/23 (60 compared to 69%), this is partly due to the higher number of applications received overall. Indeed, the actual *number* of successful applications is only slightly lower – 53 compared to 56. Overall grant spend is also slightly lower as any underspend due to lower numbers of applications received during the pandemic years of 2020-22 were fully distributed in the preceding 2022/23 year. With greater numbers of applications inevitably comes greater competition for funds and this is reflected in the lower success rate in 2023/24 compared to the previous year. However, at 60% - just under two thirds of those applying were awarded funding. This is an indication of good quality applications coming through and demonstrates that projects that do apply have a good chance of receiving funds – something that is important for a grass roots funding programme like the Community Chest. The fact that both the numbers and proportion of first time applications and those that have received five or more grants has remained fairly consistent with 2022/23 is another positive factor to note. This ensures that a good balance remains between funding new and emerging projects with providing longer term support.


The pie charts above also demonstrate how the programme has generally returned to a more predictable pattern in terms of the proportion of applications received under each priority. The two priority areas that traditionally receive the highest proportion of applications overall (Reducing Isolation and Improving Mental/Physical Health) have once again received the highest number of applications in 2023/24, as they did in 2022/23 following a dip in the previous year. While the proportion of applicants applying under the reducing isolation theme have remained the same, improving mental and physical health represents the priority area that has seen the largest increase compared to the previous year. In contrast, the biggest reduction in applications appears to be under the improving education and skills priority. Interestingly, education and skills experienced the highest increase in the previous year compared to the preceding 2021/22 year so this dip may be inferred as returning to a more expected level. Taking into account the ongoing cost-of-living crisis, while still low in terms of number/proportion of overall applications, it is reassuring that the proportion of applications under the advice and support priority area has increased slightly.

A decision was taken two years ago to split the Improving the Environment and Increasing Community Safety theme into two separate themes focusing each on environment and community safety. This was an attempt to encourage more applications under each and it is reassuring to see that the proportion of applications under the making Islington a more sustainable place to live priority have almost doubled in the last year, albeit from a low starting base. Unfortunately however, only one application was received under the increasing community safety priority in 2023/24 (which was not awarded funding).

## Facts and figures – who we reached in 2022/23







The charts above provide a breakdown of the ethnicity, age, and gender of all people that have benefited from the support provided as a result of Islington Council's Community Chest funding over the 2022/23 period. The data is derived from returned monitoring reports so provides an accurate reflection of the work actually undertaken.

Although slightly lower compared to 2021/22, the breakdowns demonstrate that the ICCC programme continues to provide good reach for BAMER communities, representing 54% (57% in 2021/22) of all beneficiaries compared to 32% overall Islington population (not including Irish/White Other).

In terms of age groups, the highest overall proportion of beneficiaires from funded projects in 2022/23 were adults aged between 25-59. While this is understandable given that it is also the widest age category, at 42%, this is slightly lower compared to 2021/22 (44%). Just under a quarter (23%) of overall beneficiaries are older people (60+) which has remained fairly consistent with 2021/22. The proportion of beneficiaries under the age of 5 (7%) has increased slightly compared to 2021/22 (6%), while the proportion of beneficiaries aged 6-11 has reduced from 9 to 6%. The proportion of beneficiaries for the 12-16 age group have remained the same (7%) while for 17-24s this has reduced from 9 to 7% (and represents a further decline from 12% in 2020/21). While these figures might appear low when taken individually, taken together they demonstrate that 27% of beneficiaries of the ICCC funded projects are children and young people. Finally, it is positive to see that there has seen a slight increase in the proportion of males benefiting from the funding programme in 2022/23 (from 39 to 41%).
